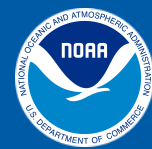

She was recruited in Hot Springs during her senior year in high school before enlisting in the United States Navy on July 25, 1989 as a Dental Technician. For her ten years of enlisted service she was assigned to Naval Dental Center, Newport, then 12th Dental Company, Cherry Point, North Carolina and National Naval Dental Center, Bethesda, Maryland.

She holds a Master of Health Administration degree from Central Michigan University. In August 1999, she was commissioned as a Lieutenant Junior Grade in the Medical Service Corps through the Inservice Procurement Program. From there her stellar career has taken her onto many influential staff and leadership positions including serving as Navy Legislative Liaison on Capitol Hill, educating legislators on Navy medicine policies and procedures. She is a member of the American College of Healthcare Executives.

Green has received numerous awards, including five Meritorious Service Medals, one Joint Service Commendation Medal, three Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals and four Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals.

Green relieved CAPT. Kristin Hodapp. During the ceremony, they both wished each other well, and commended the team at the New England clinic for their dedication and hard work. □

29 August: Coast Guard Cutter Campbell Returns to Home Port Newport

Coast Guard Cutter Campbell, our adopted unit, returns to Home Port Newport following a 73-day Patrol in Windward Passage.

While deployed, Campbell served in the lead role as commander, task unit for multiple assets operating in the Windward Passage and coordinated the employment of Coast Guard Cutters Venturous (WMEC 625), Isaac Mayo (WPC 1112), Joseph Napier (WPC 1115) and Robert Yered (WPC 1104).



12 Sept: SAN DIEGO- USCG and the Royal Canadian Navy Interdict \$44.2M Drug Shipment

The crew aboard Her Majesty's Canadian Ship Yellowknife (HMCS-706) and a U.S. Coast Guard Law Enforcement Detachment team interdicted more than 3,100 lbs. of cocaine approximately 430 miles southwest of Acapulco, Mexico, on 5 September.



"I congratulate the entire crew of the Yellowknife for their successful patrol in the Eastern Pacific, and I thank them for their dedicated service," said Capt. Tim Lavier, 11th District chief of response. □



16 August: HALIFAX, Nova Scotia- The U.S. Coast Guard, Royal Canadian and Royal Danish navies Prepared for 'Operation Nanook'

The tri-nation pre-sail conference was held in Nova Scotia's capital city of Halifax in preparation for Operation Nanook, the signature Canadian-led exercise that highlights respective nations' ability to cooperate in the Arctic to address emergent threats and enforce international maritime regulations.

"Operation Nanook is an opportunity for all of us as allies to work together and collaborate to continue to put a presence in the northern waters," said Royal Canadian navy Capt. Gord Noseworthy, commander of Task Group 300.10.

As ice melts in the Arctic, illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing threatens food and economic security and raises concerns over potential human and labor rights violations.

Cmdr. Brian Gismervik, commanding officer of Coast Guard Cutter Northland (WMEC 904) said. "This has an immediate, real impact on the area's safety and security. □

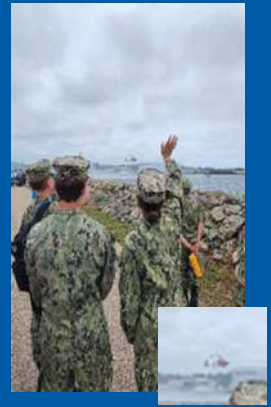

Both Corps' intensely busy schedules between training and inspections, include fundraising for their units and nonprofits, trips to museums, regional swim meets and training. □

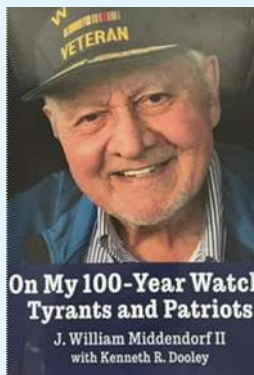

AMB William J Middendorf, a Lifetime Navy League Member celebrated his 100 Birthday at his home quietly in Little Compton, Rhode Island, with about 100 friends and relatives.
