## **Newport County Council Events**

## 19 January: Newport County Council Hosted Meeting of NE Regional Councils at Newport Wyndham Hotel, Middletown

A first for the NCCNLUS was hosting the Annual Meeting of the North East Regional Councils of the Navy League, US. Local Council President, CAPT Rob Winneg, USN (Ret) welcomed Navy League National President, Christopher Townsend, Guest of Honor, who presented an update of the National Council activities, advice and encouragement to the Councils from his days as a President of the Central Florida Council prior to becoming Vice-President, then President of National NLUS. Regional presidents attending the meeting and presenting reports were Casco Bay, ME, President Rusty Robertson; Massachusetts Bay Council President, Tom Hennessey; and Portsmouth, NH Council President Kevin Galeaz. The report given by Len DiLorenzo, NCCNLUS Membership Chair, highlighted the local Council's outreach to the Business Community in support of the Military Sea Services and maritime industries of Narragansett Bay. The meeting was organized by the NE Regional President, Bob Shaughnessy and supported by NLUS CEO Mike Stevens who joined the business meeting via Zoom.

Navy League Portsmouth, NH Council President Kevin Galeaz gave an overview of the effort led by his Council to erect the USS Thresher memorial at Arlington National Cemetery. The monument was dedicated on September 26, 2019, commemorating the service and sacrifice of the crew of the USS Thresher (SSN-593), the world's most technologically advanced nuclear-powered submarine of its day. On April 10, 1963, Thresher sank during deep-diving tests off the coast of Massachusetts, killing all 129 personnel aboard: 16 officers, 96 enlisted sailors and 17 civilian technicians. It was the deadliest accident in submarine history, leading the Navy to establish the SUBSAFE Submarine Safety Program.

#### **Tribute to Joe McEnness Sr.**

Commodore Joseph F. McEnness, a long-time resident of Newport, RI and a life member of the Newport Council NLUS, passed away on 10 February in Palm Beach Gardens, FL.

Joe was an accomplished Marine Engineer, spending nearly 50 years at sea, retiring as The Commodore Chief Engineer, Texaco Marine. A dedicated Navy Leaguer, he served in 2002-2003 as co-chair of the Commissioning Committee of the guided missile destroyer USS Chaffee (DDG-90) in Newport. He spearheaded a most successful fundraising effort for the Commissioning which was a banner day for Newport and the Chafee family.

### **National Events**

#### 27 January: Secretary of the Navy Carlos Del Toro Celebrates the Naming of USNS Robert Ballard (T-AGS 67), Washington, DC

Announced in December 2022, the future USNS Robert Ballard (T-AGS 67) honors Dr. Robert Ballard, a retired U.S. Navy Commander. The keel for the ship was laid in October at the then-Halter Marine shipyard in Mississippi and is projected to be delivered to the fleet in 2026.

The Pathfinder-class oceanographic survey ship will be a multi-mission vessel that will perform acoustic, biological, physical and geophysical surveys providing much of the U.S. military's information on the ocean environment.

Ballard, a tenured professor of oceanography at the University of Rhode Island's Graduate School of Oceanography and National Geographic Explorer at large, is widely known as a discoverer of the final resting place of the RMS Titanic. The name selection of T-AGS 67 follows the tradition of naming survey ships after explorers, oceanographers and distinguished marine surveyors.

Secretary Del Toro and Dr. Ballard discussed the celebration of the ship naming, National Geographic's relationship with the Navy, and the importance of science and exploration to the maritime services.

### 8 January: Celebrating Success: Navy Supply Corps School

## 20 February: VCNO Adm. Jim Kilby visits RI, Meeting Industry Leaders at Electric Boat, Quonset and SEA Leadership, NAVSTA Newport

While at Quonset Point, Kilby received updates on the company's work on the Navy's Virginiaclass fast-attack submarines and the Columbia-class ballistic-missile submarine to include engineering and design, construction, and overhauls and repairs. The Columbia-class will replace the

Ohio-class as the Navy's contribution to the nuclear triad, which remains the most survivable leg of the U.S. nuclear strategic deterrent force.

"This is the future of our nation's undersea dominance," said Kilby. "We must deliver our submarines on time and on budget and we can't do it without our industry partners, Congress and the immense support of the New England community."


